

Thomas Ward, Monteagle's servant, warned the plotters of the letter.

In response, she increased the persecution of Catholics in England.

Lord Salisbury ordered a search of Westminster. Fawkes was arrested in the cellar.

She was a Catholic accused of plotting to overthrow Elizabeth.

Fawkes would light the fuse—other plotters would start a revolt in the Midlands

Henry VIII broke from the Catholic Church and created the protestant Church of England



The Gunpowder Plot Timeline **Task:** colour code cause of the plot reason for failure narrative (story) only 1534: The Act of Supremacy Henry VIII breaks from the Catholic Church by creating the protestant Church of England 1570: The Pope Excommunicated Queen Elizabeth In response, she increased the persecution of Catholics in England. 1587: Mary Queen of Scots Executed by the order of Queen Elizabeth She was a Catholic accused of plotting to overthrow Elizabeth. 1588: The Spanish Armada is Defeated Now all English Catholics seen as a threat. Catholics forced to attend Protestant services. 1603: Elizabeth Died and James Stuart (VI) of Scotland also becomes King of England (James I) Catholics believed he will be more tolerant of their faith —he had a Catholic wife. 1603: James I End Recusancy Fines Against Catholics His more relaxed attitude led to Catholics becoming more visible in society. January 1604: Puritans put pressure on King James Under pressure, James brought back recusancy fines and Catholic priests made to leave England. March 1604: Robert Catesby's father put in prison His father was a Catholic who protected a priest. Catesby was a very influential person. May 1604: The plotters first meet Catesby persuaded the first conspirators to join him. Thomas Percy and Fawkes are present. March 1605: The plot takes shape The plotters rented a cellar under Parliament, 36 barrels of gunpowder are stored there. April 1605: Fawkes spotted travelling to Flanders by English spies He was recruiting supporters for the plot. Catesby also gathered more English plotters. October 1605: The final details of the plot decided Fawkes would light the fuse—other plotters would start a revolt in the Midlands 26th October 1605: The anonymous letter

Delivered to Lord Monteagle warning him not to attend the opening of Parliament.

4th November 1605: The plotters ignore a warning

Thomas Ward, Monteagle's servant, warned the plotters of the letter.

5th November 1605: The day of reckoning

Lord Salisbury ordered a search of Westminster. Fawkes was arrested in the cellar.


